The CHS is a professional association founded in 1971, whose membership includes over 450 hematologists, hematopathologists and research scientists across Canada.

The mission of the CHS is to lead and influence hematology clinical practice and research in Canada, by being a recognized and valued voice of the Canadian hematology community.

To achieve this mission, the CHS publishes a newsletter, The Microenvironment, a popular publication among our membership. This newsletter is produced through our head office in Ottawa, three times annually. It has considerable educational value providing reviews of various topics in hematology as well as descriptions of how and when to treat various disorders.

Additionally, we support research among hematology trainees and faculty. The CHS offers awards for top abstracts presented at the Annual Society of Hematology (ASH) meeting. We also provide small research grants in the form of the RK Smiley Awards. Finally, we offer an annual prize for the best Canadian publication in the field of hematology.

On an ongoing basis, we develop several communication products to support these initiatives, including a newsletter publication, maintenance of a website, posters, flyers, information brochures, etc. We have also instituted a new interactive web portal. We maintain a central database of membership which is also used for up-to-date information and promotion of special events and research competitions. Due to the evolving nature of each of these initiatives, to keep them current and relevant, they incur ongoing costs.

Membership dues do not support the full costs of running the society and fulfilling our education and research mission. We therefore rely on the generous donations from our industry partners.

We would gratefully welcome your support for the initiatives outlined in this proposal. Who we Are

The CHS is a professional association founded in 1971, whose membership includes most of the hematologists in Canada. Our main goals are to maintain the integrity and vitality of the specialty of hematology, by participating with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in designing training programs for our successors, encouraging and rewarding scholarly research, and providing a forum for communication and mutual support for all of our colleagues in both community and academic settings.

The first annual meeting of the Society was held in the Richelieu Room of the Chateau Laurier in Ottawa on the 20th of January 1971, with fifty-six members present. The draft bylaws were presented by the executive and approved. R. Kennedy Smiley was appointed as the first president with Al Cousineau as vice president, W. Corbett as secretary treasurer.

The CHS Web Portal Opportunities

The CHS has developed a web-portal (www.chsportal.ca) to facilitate hematology education in Canada. This portal has 5 primary features described below. We are seeking support to continue this portal.

1) Monthly academic hematology cases

Each month a new case related to a topic in malignant or benign hematology is posted along with a multiple choice quiz. Subsequently, answers to the quiz are provided and a summary article is posted highlighting knowledge gaps that become evident from the answers to the questions. The cases also include a discussion forum. These monthly cases cover the spectrum of hematology and provide a great way to keep up-to-date on new developments in the field. Approximately 40-50 hematologists participate in these cases each month.

2) Image challenge

Monthly, we are also providing an image challenge where we post on the portal a picture of a challenging blood film or bone marrow. This monthly challenge is a great way to keep one's hematopathology skills sharp.

3) Drug reimbursement library

The CHS web portal offers province-specific reimbursement criteria for hematology drugs. The goal of this portal is be the go-to site for questions on coverage and inclusion criteria for prescription hematology drugs. Also, it is interesting to note the differences in criteria for drug reimbursement across the provinces. Email blasts to CHS members can be provided alerting them to changes in reimbursement criteria

4) “Message Me”

Through the CHS portal, one can send an email to a fellow CHS member. This feature allows for networking and meet-ups with colleagues at meetings such as ASH.

5) Education center

The CHS portal offers a site where industry sponsored educational information such as webinars, videos, and articles can be posted, viewed and archived.
