

## **Hematopathologist, Department of Clinical Pathology Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre**

Applications are invited for the position of Staff Hematopathologist, Department of Clinical Pathology at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre (Sunnybrook) in Toronto, Canada, a fully affiliated academic Health Sciences facility of the University of Toronto. Effective start date is July 1, 2017, or earlier as mutually agreed upon.

The Sunnybrook Department of Clinical Pathology and its Division of Laboratory Hematology are seeking a faculty member at the Assistant/Associate/Full Professor Level with diagnostic and academic interests in Hematopathology and Laboratory Hematology. The successful candidate must be an experienced academic hematopathologist with established track record and will join an academic laboratory faculty with diverse diagnostic expertise, teaching responsibilities and clinical research activities. The department has a high volume of interesting and challenging cases and utilizes leading edge technologies, including flow cytometry, molecular diagnostics and cancer cytogenetics. Minimum requirements include MD degree, certification in Hematological Pathology from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or its equivalent, and eligibility for registration with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. The successful candidate will have an academic appointment in the Department of Laboratory Medicine and Pathobiology, University of Toronto, at a rank consistent with academic qualifications.
